- Founded as the result of the March 2017 Inaugural Summit held at International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP)
- PTACC Inaugural Summit organizers: AdCare Criminal Justice Services, C4 Recovery Solutions, Center for Health and Justice at TASC, Civil Citation Network, George Mason University, International Association of Chiefs of Police, and Western Carolina University
- Named for the collaborative relationship between police, treatment, and community necessary to make police diversion possible



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PTACC Collaborative: Our Mission, Purpose, and Cornerstone

- **Mission** – To strategically enhance the quantity and quality of community behavioral health and social service options through engagement in pre-arrest diversion
- **Purpose** – To provide NATIONAL vision, leadership, advocacy, and education to facilitate the practice of pre-arrest diversion across the US
- **Cornerstone** – PTACC is open-source, open to any and all. PTACC is “non-denominational” as to which model/brand of pre-arrest diversion is appropriate for a jurisdiction; each community must determine which approach(es) solves its problem, fits the local situation, and can be addressed through current behavioral health capacity.

- **Leadership Strategy Area:** the PTACC Leadership team
- **Treatment, Housing and Recovery Strategy Area:** for behavioral health, housing, and service providers to ensure their equal and critical seats at the table
